ON THE GROUND: THERAPY ABROAD THAILAND TRIP

THIS SPRING, A GROUP OF IU STUDENTS WILL BE GOING ON A TRIP TO THAILAND ORGANIZED BY THERAPY ABROAD. THERAPY ABROAD IS AN ORGANIZATION THAT FACILITATES PRACTICAL EXPERIENCE FOR UNDERGRADUATE STUDENTS, POST-BACC AND GRADUATE STUDENTS IN THEIR FIELDS OF STUDY. THE TRIP WILL TAKE PLACE AFTER THE SEMESTER CONCLUDES, FROM MAY 10 TO MAY 21. THEY WILL VISIT CHIANG MAI, THE LARGEST PROVINCE OF THAILAND, AND THE THIRD LARGEST CITY IN THE COUNTRY. STUDENTS WILL GET THE CHANCE TO COLLABORATE WITH LOCAL ORGANIZATIONS AND GAIN HANDS-ON SPEECH THERAPY EXPERIENCE AND OBSERVATION HOURS. THEY WILL ALSO GET THE OPPORTUNITY TO LEARN ABOUT THE CULTURE AND HISTORY OF THAILAND.

#### WHEN SHOULD I START PLANNING FOR STUDY ABROAD IF I'D LIKE TO GO?

HONESTLY IT'S NEVER TOO EARLY TO START THINKING ABOUT STUDY ABROAD, AND I ENCOURAGE ANYONE INTERESTED TO ATTEND A "FIRST STEPS INFO SESSION" FROM IU EDUCATION ABROAD TO GET AN INTRODUCTION TO HOW IT WORKS. HOWEVER, YOU DON'T REALLY NEED TO START SERIOUS PLANNING UNTIL YOU'RE WITHIN A YEAR OF WHEN YOU'D LIKE TO GO. SUMMER AND FALL PROGRAM APPLICATIONS OPEN IN EARLY DECEMBER AND WILL BE DUE SOMETIME IN JANUARY OR FEBRUARY. SPRING PROGRAM APPLICATIONS OPEN IN EARLY AUGUST AND WILL BE DUE IN LATE AUGUST OR SEPTEMBER.

### **FACULTY SPOTLIGHT**

#### PROFESSOR LAURA SMITH

FOR THIS EDITION OF SPOTLIGHT, WE GOT THE OPPORTUNITY TO INTERVIEW PROFESSOR LAURA SMITH, WHO RECENTLY JOINED IU'S AMERICAN SIGN LANGUAGE PROGRAM. SHE GREW UP IN WESTERN MICHIGAN ON A FARM WITH HER FAMILY, WHO ARE ALL DEAF. WHEN ASKED ABOUT HER FAVORITE PART OF WHERE SHE GREW UP, PROFESSOR SMITH HAD MANY FOND MEMORIES TO SHARE. SHE MENTIONED HOW SHE PARTICIPATED IN 4H, WHICH ALLOWED HER TO MAKE MANY FRIENDS AND TRAVEL AROUND.

During this time, she would also teach her friends different signs. Professor Smith went on to attend Gallaudet University for her bachelor's in ASL Studies. She then received her master's from McDaniel College in Deaf Bilingual Education. Here, she did training in order to work with grade school children who are Deaf, and this piqued her interest in working with college-level students. Before coming to Bloomington, Professor Smith was a legal court interpreter in California. She went on to do formal training and continued her work as an interpreter in Many courtrooms, including some in Washington, D.C. and Kentucky. Additionally,

PROFESSOR SMITH WORKED AS A DEAF INTERPRETER IN CLINICAL SETTINGS FOR MENTAL HEALTH SERVICES. AFTER THIS, SHE REALIZED SHE WANTED TO BE CLOSER TO HOME, SO SHE MOVED TO INDIANA TO BE CLOSER TO HER FAMILY IN MICHIGAN AND INDIANAPOLIS!

GROWING UP, PROFESSOR SMITH TAUGHT HER FRIENDS HOW TO SIGN AND COMMUNICATE, ALTHOUGH TEACHING ASL WAS NEVER ON HER RADAR. IN COLLEGE, ONE OF HER PROFESSORS ASKED HER TO SUBSTITUTE TEACH, AND SHE QUICKLY FOUND HER GIFT IN THE CLASSROOM. SHE ALWAYS WANTED TO TEACH AT IU BECAUSE SHE KNEW HOW EXCEPTIONAL THE ASL PROGRAM WAS. HER CURRENT POSITION HERE IS AS AN ASL SENIOR LECTURER. WHEN ASKED ABOUT HER FAVORITE PART OF HER JOB, SHE IMMEDIATELY RESPONDED WITH THE FACULTY AND TEAM COMMUNITY, AS IT IS FILLED WITH LOTS OF KNOWLEDGE SHARING AND DEEP CONVERSATIONS. ADDITIONALLY, SHE GREATLY VALUES INSPIRING STUDENTS AND LANGUAGE SHARING IN THE CLASSROOM. PROFESSOR SMITH ALSO MENTIONED HOW SHE REALLY ENJOYS BLOOMINGTON'S NATURAL AND DOWN-TO-EARTH ENVIRONMENT. IN HER FREE TIME, SHE LOVES SPENDING TIME OUTDOORS. SHE RECENTLY SWITCHED UP HER ROUTINE AND TOOK UP PICKLEBALL. SHE ALSO LOVES GARDENING, AS IT FONDLY REMINDS HER OF HER CHILDHOOD. LATELY, SHE HAS EXPANDED HER GARDEN BY ADDING HERBS AND FLOWERS IN HOPES OF ATTRACTING BEES, BIRDS, AND BUTTERFLIES! SHE HOPES TO DESIGN HER BACKYARD GARDEN SO THAT SHE CAN SUPPORT THESE CREATURES THROUGH WHAT SHE GROWS. IN TERMS OF BLOOMINGTON, SHE WISHES TO FURTHER EXPLORE THE TRAILS IN THE AREA WITH HER BROTHER ON HER ELECTRIC BIKE.

When asked about providing any advice for students studying ASL, she encourages you to keep an open mind and use technology to your advantage! You can find Deaf influencers and signing videos online, which is a great way to expose yourself to new information about Deaf culture.
